CFC Holds Leaders' Assembly

There was a gathering of all CFC servant-leaders last March 12 at the gym of St Francis de Sales parish in Burnaby. In attendance were all household heads and up and ministry heads and coordinators. The theme was: Jesus, the true North!

In the national anthem of Canada, we sing the line "true north strong and free." True north is where the compass points to, for the ship to arrive correctly and safely to its destination. As Christians and as CFC, we also have our True North, Jesus Christ! God has a special mission for putting the True North in our land. He wants us to be that compass that will unite and bring Canada back to Him! Based on the 2011 theme, "Put on the Full Armor



of God," we use the words of Jesus and events in His life as our strength and inspiration as we do our work of evangelization and family renewal that He has entrusted to us here in Canada.

The event started with the Holy Mass celebrated in the church. YFC AJ Cabaccang led the assembly into a very vibrant opening worship. Danny Felices then gave the first talk – "Man shall not live on Bread alone" (Luke 4:1-13). He walked us through the temptations Jesus faced and how He overcame them all. The first temptation deals with the necessities of life, and how the important is often given priority over the essential in life. Our spiritual formation and service in CFC is often put on hold because we tend to rely on our own strength rather than on God. Lina Ople shared with us how they surmounted the difficulties which confronted her and her family through prayers and by answering the call of God through CFC. Danny then led us through a reflection on our susceptibility to temptation and how we should toughen ourselves.

After lunch, the assembly resumed with KFC Justin Ramos leading the afternoon prayers. Talk no. 2 – "Remove the Stone" (John 11:39) was preceded by a sharing by Rocky Ysonza on how she faced seemingly desperate health and economic situation for her and her family and how, through the grace of God and by just trusting in His goodness, they overcame their difficulties. Joe Pelingon then talked about the stones in our lives: fear, discouragement, worry, anger, and addiction or attachment to worldly things; and how they burden us and hinders us from fully giving our lives to Him. He told us that Jesus has given us His full armor, and that we are to make use of it fully in order to rid ourselves of the stones that are weighing us down in our lives. He then led us to prayer and a reflection on what stones burden us and how we should cast them off.

After a brief break, Jimmy Dimaculangan walked us though the Transfiguration (Luke 9:34) in the last talk – "This is my Beloved Son, Listen to Him." This event gives us a glimpse of heaven, our ultimate destination. While the full armor of God protects us from the enemy, these offensive weapons allow us to attack and win battles for Him: commitment to Christ's cause, zeal in witnessing for Him, and the Word of God as our spiritual sword. The final message of the Transfiguration is "Listen to Him." We must pray and listen to Him. He wants to empower us to build the human railway which will unite Canada to become the True North.

"We are More than Conquerors" - YFC Canada



The weekend February 18-20, 2011 defined YFC Canada in the next three (3) years. It was the YFC National Leaders' Summit held in Winnipeg, Manitoba. It was attended by YFC leaders and couple coordinators that total to 108 delegates across Canada. The event was also graced by the presence of Erin Kinsella the Director of the Youth Office from the Archdiocese of Winnipeg.

The summit was entitled "More than Conquerors" from the bible verse Joshua 1:9 "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the LORD your God will be with you wherever you go." The goal of the summit is to gather all the YFC leaders across Canada, to share the direction of YFC Canada in the next three (3) years, and for YFC Canada to move in one direction.

The event started with the first session "The Legacy" delivered as a talk-show of God's victories in YFC Canada and was given by John Acosta. The next day, the second session talks about "Anointed Leadership" given by Candy Subang followed by the pre-workshop orientation given by the YFC National Chairman, Tito George Fournier and program sharing. In the afternoon that followed, it was spent on planning the responses of each area per direction. The three directions of YFC Canada are: Full-scale Advocacies; Full-blast in Evangelization, and Full-fledge Missionaries. The evening session then started with the anticipated mass celebrated by Fr. Martin Bradbury, Holy Cross Parish Priest. This was followed by the third session "Into your Hands" given by Vince Gomba. The fourth session, "More than Conquerors" was given by Gelo Saludo with a closing activity of Adoration to the Holy Eucharist followed by a powerful praisefest led by Jason Diala, YFC Area Head of Calgary.

The entire event was a success. It has been three (3) years since the last NLS and this one was really what YFC Canada needed. This sets the direction where each area will be going and hope to achieve after three years. As Canada's National Anthem states that it is the "True North," YFC Canada also believes that God is the True North. YFC Canada therefore is reclaiming the nation for God.



It's truly amazing when God calls you to do his work. He scares you, humbles you and then empowers you. That's exactly how I felt during the SFC ICON in Camarines Sur. Who would have thought, out of all people, I'd be chosen to make a stand in attesting my faith in front of 6500 SFC! Coming into the conference, speaking like that in front of so many was definitely the furthest thing from my mind. It left me feeling vulnerable resulting in questioning myself whether what I said was significant enough to be heard. It's funny how much you end up relying on God during these times of panic. And maybe, that's all he wanted from me at the moment – to rely on him whole-heartedly!

Before the actual conference, I was fortunate enough to attend the SFC Pre-ICON at Mount Carmel Parish. It was an exciting two days that consisted of some servant evangelism, some volunteer work and lots of fellowship! The first day of Pre-ICON was spent running around Naga City. I was completely disoriented and found it pretty amusing how I got from place to place via the *tricycle*. We were divided up into groups that had a specific task in doing service work. My group ended up doing some cleaning at the central park. The people working there didn't seem to mind us taking over their job for a bit. In fact, one worker was even an inactive SFC member for 5 years. He felt neglected the last couple of years but decided to come back in the community simply because one member of our group invited him. He claimed afterwards that it must have been a sign from God - and it definitely was!

My group also had another opportunity in serving the poor. On the second day we went to GK Del Rosario where both the Sibol and Sagip School was located. Over 40 children came running towards our jeepney the moment we arrived. Children ranging from 3 to 9 years of age were eagerly waiting in anticipation as to what we had in store for them that afternoon. A bit overwhelmed by the amount of kids, it was intimidating to see how disciplined they were. Our team was a bit nervous, but there's nothing like singing "Making Melodies" to break the ice! By the end of the afternoon, everyone was running around playing games and forming friendships that will never be forgotten. Their laughter was contagious, their smile genuine. The children taught us that it's easier to find happiness, if we are grateful for our blessings. And they were the leading examples in that! >> Page 5

and its Family Ministries is our way of responding to The 'Great Commission' on Matthew 28:19 'Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit'. Arzadon adds that CFC's vision of "Families in the Holy Spirit renewing the face of the earth" and their mission of "Building the Church of the Home and the Church of the Poor" is their way of fulfilling this mandate; thus the Evangelization Rally is a yearly event that starts off all the activities of CFC and all its ministries. Arzadon also emphasizes that the CFC is a parish-based community. It works with the parishes in its evangelization activities and encourages members to serve in their respective parishes. It mobilizes its members to support the causes sponsored by the archdiocese.

The Archdiocese of Vancouver through Pat Gillespie, Director of the Office of Evangelization, gave a keynote speech on how parish communities can work together to work as evangelizers for the Church. He says that the evangelical work of the Archdioceses stems from the synod. "Gathering together can bring an enthusiasm and zeal for evangelization, which was exactly one of the hopes that came out of the Archdiocesan Synod. There has been a growing culture of evangelization in the archdiocese and rallies such as this past one really give a boost to this growth."

He was so amazed at the turn-out of CFC members for the rally that he took pictures of the crowd before his talk. In his talk, he told the crowd the essentials of evangelical work, and how this work is one that is a collaborative effort of parish communities. "My hope is that we will encounter Christ more intimately and that we will help others encounter Him, either for the first time, or anew, or in a deeper way." He adds that Couples for Christ does a great job of encouraging each brother and sister to authentically and naturally bring the faith to their life; and in particular by beginning in our families. "Evangelization is for people like you and me; that is, for all of us. I am grateful for the ministry of Couples for Christ and their love of Christ, it is very evident; they inspire and encourage me. It was an honour to participate and witness a community of joy and abundant life."

The theme for evangelization for CFC for the year 2011 is "Putting on the Full Armor of God" which is drawn from Ephesians 6:10-17. The CFC community has activities lined up for the year, including a CFC Western Conference in Whistler this May.

DEEPENING OUR PRAYER LIFE



On October 2010, CFC Vancouver Leaders attended a Deepening our Prayer Life Retreat at IC Delta. Our retreat masters were the lovely and passionate couple – Bro Roquel and Sis Nina Ponte. The retreat was centered on deepening our knowledge of God and Self. Coming into this retreat caused us to reflect on a few things. For one, exactly 5 years ago in October 2005, we underwent the first Spiritual Deepening Retreat. It was conducted in the same venue and led by the same retreat masters. And we pondered and asked ourselves – 5 years ago, we began the journey from the mind to the heart - a journey of getting intimate with God through worship and scripture. Yes, we learned that the longest journey in life is from the mind to the heart.

We have all tried to seek Him in different ways, most of them from the outside – our family, our community, our church, etc., only to realize that it is a mistake to spend a lifetime seeking what is already within – that God is not just found on the outside, but rather deep within our hearts. And deep within our hearts, we will also find that God created us for His glory, and we are all called to praise and worship Him. Worship raises intimacy with God and intimacy creates influence – and influence creates favours. No wonder, we are all so blessed! It has been 5 years, we have grown, we have changed, and we became better – or not? We asked ourselves – did we become better people? Were we beautiful people? Were we blessed? Were we called? Where did we fall short? We realized that it was only the beginning – and the journey continues.

Deepening our prayer life allowed us to learn new things - tragedies in life did not come from closed doors that we failed to open, but rather the closed doors we failed to open and enter. Remember the first time we were invited to the Christian Life Program? Remember how we opened the door to a new life in community and experiencing God – an experience we could have passed, had we not opened the door and entered. Now here we are, many of us with a number of years in the community. We are already deep in understanding our relationship with our God. So what do we do next? We go deeper - deeper in our knowledge of God, and deeper in our knowledge of our self. The retreat also allowed us to learn discursive prayer - the form of prayer in which the reflections of the mind are more active than the affections of the will. It is called discursive because discursion is the act of the mind that proceeds from one truth to the knowledge of another truth. Here we learned God's personal message to each one of us.

We then went on to God's invitation – coming apart and rest awhile. Here we reflected and meditated on Scripture. Then we went on going into the deep – contemplation. Here we went into a dialogue with God, and configuration – as we went deeper with Him,



He increases in our life, and we diminish. We learned to pray, not only asking God that we may be like Him, but also asking Him to be alive in us. We were also encouraged to start journaling. Journaling keeps us in the present moment, attentive to what the Lord is saying to us, and helps us remember our interaction with God during our prayer times. The second day of the retreat was even more enlightening – deepening our knowledge of our self. We did our own life-scripts and discovered blocks to our spiritual maturity. We looked into the consequences of sin in our life and did an honest evaluation of self (this was a revelation in itself). We also learned the practice of God's presence by St. Theresa of Jesus and St. John of the Cross – the realities of God's presence in our lives - His power, control, domination, and authority. We then cried out the call to freedom free to obey God's righteousness, free to accept our limitations, free to see our gifts, rejoice in our gifts, and use our gifts to serve God, free to rejoice in the gifts of others, and the freedom to allow God to do with us as He wills.


